1. The chorus of one song by this artist notes that “The Roc is still alive every time I rhyme,” that song also samples the theme from Diamonds are Forever. The title objects of another of his tracks include “cop,” “flash,” “spot,” “strobe,” and “street,” and this man collaborated with Jay Z on the album Watch the Throne. Name this rapper of the albums Late Registration, My Beautiful Dark Twisted Fantasy and Yeezus.

ANSWER: Kanye West [accept either]

2. Recreational activities in this city include hiking in Tijuca National Forest and surfing and playing “fute volei” at beaches like Ipanema. This city’s Maracanã Stadium is the unofficial stadium for Flamengo, the nation’s most popular soccer club, and was renovated in preparation for the 2014 World Cup. That stadium will also host the opening ceremonies of the 2016 Summer Olympics. For the point, name this Brazilian city, whose preparations for the Olympics were called “the worst ever” by an IOC official.

ANSWER: Rio de Janeiro

3. Minor villains on this show include Sinister Slug, Dirty Bubble, and the John Rhys-Davies-voiced Man Ray. The protagonist of this show works at an establishment that makes products that “go right to your thighs... then you blow up.” Karen describes a major antagonist on this show as “1% evil, 99% hot gas,” that character’s Chum Bucket competes with the Krusty Krab. Name this cartoon whose namesake character lives “in a pineapple under the sea.”

ANSWER: Spongebob Squarepants

4. Fans involved in this event were quickly blamed for it, in part because of an incident at Heysel Stadium in Belgium a few years prior. It was investigated by the Taylor Report, which found police responsible and recommended that stadiums in England install seats throughout. Fans on the field stopped the game during, for the point, what tragedy in which 96 Liverpool fans were crushed to death by overcrowding?

ANSWER: Hillsborough Stadium Disaster

5. This movie won the first Academy Award for Best Animated Feature and it spawned several sequels. Voice actors included John Lithgow as the antagonist, with Eddie Murphy providing comic relief while Cameron Diaz and Michael Myers voiced the lead roles. Name this Dreamworks movie about an ogre.

ANSWER: Shrek

6. In 2013, this man purchased the world's entire supply of donkey cheese, which is only grown in his home nation. He is famous for entertaining fans with dancing and impressions of other players. He has faced Rafael Nadal 40 times, an Open Era record for two players, and is the only player other than Roger Federer to defeat Nadal in multiple grand slam finals. In 2011, he won 10 tournaments, three grand slams and 41 consecutive matches. For the point, name this Serbian tennis star.

ANSWER: Novak Djokovic

7. This actress played the lead role in *Winter's Bone*, and was Mystique in *X-Men: First Class*. She also received the Best Actress award at the Oscars in 2012 for her role in *Silver Linings Playbook*. She is more known, however for her role in an adaptation of a young adult dystopian novel. Name this actress from *The Hunger Games*?

ANSWER: Jennifer Lawrence

8. One song by this band opens "Oh, no, I see/ A spider web, it's tangled up with me," and that song appears on an album along with "Everything's Not Lost" and "Spies." A different song of theirs closes "Lights will guide you home/ And ignite your bones," while yet another notes "For some reason I can't explain/ I know Saint Peter won't call my name. Fronted by Chris Martin, name this band that created the album X&Y and the song "Viva la Vida."

ANSWER: Coldplay

9. Clara Hughes, the only Olympian to win multiple medals at both the Summer and Winter Olympics, is a cyclist and speedskater from this nation. In 1984 a runner for this nation, Ben Johnson, was stripped of a gold medal in the 100-meter sprint for steroid use. This nation dominates international curling, and their men's and women's ice hockey teams won gold medals in both 2010 and 2014. For the point, name this nation, which hosted the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver.

ANSWER: Canada

10. This man took up boxing at the suggestion of a policeman when his bike was stolen as a child. He won a gold medal at the 1960 Olympics, but claimed to have thrown it in the Ohio River after being denied service at a "whites-only" restaurant. In 1964 he became heavyweight champion by upsetting Sonny Liston, though he was stripped of his title for refusing to serve in the Vietnam War. Fights against George Foreman and Joe Frazier were among the highlights of, for the point, what boxer, nicknamed "The Greatest"?

ANSWER: Muhammad Ali

11. The Dixie version of this is flash-fried, a foot long, and weighs half a pound thanks to pulled pork, slaw, mustard-based barbecue sauce, and pickle toppings. The Halo version of this is wrapped in bacon, while the smokehouse version is covered with fried onions. The Broomstick one of these is two feet long and covered in Texas-style chili, weighing in at a full pound and costing \$26. What is this classic ballpark fare, a record 69 of which were consumed in 10 minutes by Joey Chestnut on Coney Island in 2013?

ANSWER: ballpark **hotdog** [or **sausage** or similar]

12. This character was purchased by Gardulla and represents the color blue on a chance cube. In another film, this character says “Apology accepted” after choking out captain Needa, and later crashes a dinner party on Bespin. He defeats Sebulba in a phrase before being trained by Obi-Wan Kenobi. Name this villain from Star Wars.

ANSWER: Darth **Vader** [accept **Anakin Skywalker**]

13. This man scored his first international goal in a 2-1 loss to Greece in the group stage of the Euro 2004 tournament, and later cried after losing to Greece in the tournament final. He was criticized for winking after apparently arguing for club teammate Wayne Rooney to be sent off in a match at the 2006 World Cup. He scored three goals in the 2010 World Cup, but never got to shoot in a shootout loss to Spain. In a playoff in 2014 World Cup qualifying, he scored all four of his Portugal’s goals to defeat Sweden. For the point, name this forward who plays for Real Madrid.

ANSWER: Cristiano Ronaldo

14. The first three movies of this character's franchise had the feel of 1930s adventure serials, while the fourth was more in the vein of a 1950s science fiction movie. The title character eventually marries Marion Ravenwood, and is known for his use of a bullwhip and wearing of a fedora. Name this adventurer archaeologist played by Harrison Ford.

ANSWER: **Indiana Jones**

15. This was the first Grand Slam tournament to allow amateurs to play. Stars like Pete Sampras and John McEnroe never won this tournament, as it does not favor players with a serve-and-volley style. The second grand slam of the season, this tournament is held at Roland Garros, though it considered moving in recent years to an army base near Versailles. Rafael Nadal has captured eight championships at, for the point, what tennis tournament played on a clay surface?

ANSWER: French Open

16. This actor voiced Jack Kahuna Laguna on Spongebob and starred as Mort Rainey in Secret Window. His first role saw him getting sucked into a bed in A Nightmare on Elm Street, and he played a character in a 2010 film that often asks “Why is a raven like a writing desk?” Portrayer of the Mad Hatter in Alice in Wonderland, name this actor known as Pirates of the Caribbean’s Jack Sparrow.

ANSWER: Johnny Depp

17. This man won five straight Serie A titles with three different clubs, the last with Inter Milan in 2009. He won a seventh consecutive club title with Barcelona in 2010, then was loaned to AC Milan after clashing with Pep Guardiola, where he won his eighth club title in a row. In 2013 he won FIFA Goal of the Year for a bicycle kick volley in a friendly against England and led his new French club to a league title. For the point, name this large Swedish striker who currently plays for Paris Saint-Germain.

ANSWER: Zlatan Ibrahimovic

18. Three circular goals are placed on both sides of the pitch and a volleyball and three dodgeballs are placed in the center of the field before a game of this sport can begin. The point are awarded for every goal. This sport was created in 2005 at Middlebury College in Vermont, who won the first five intercollegiate championships. Name this sport, the muggle adaptation of a fictional sport developed by J.K. Rowling.

ANSWER: [Muggle] Quidditch

19. Edward Hopper's House by the Railroad served as inspiration for one building in this film where one character exchanges her car from California Charlie. Action begins when that character steals \$40,000, eventually leading to the murder of Detective Milton Arbogast. Janet Leigh's Marion Crane is killed by a man in this movie that claims "A boy's best friend is his mother." Name this Alfred Hitchcock film starring Anthony Perkins.

ANSWER: Psycho

20. This man was famously removed by Viktor Tikhonov after just 20 minutes in favor of Vladimir Myshkin, a move which this man said cost him a gold medal. The move came after this man allowed a goal to Mark Johnson with just one second remaining in the first period of an Olympic Hockey semifinal in Lake Placid. Name this Soviet goalkeeper, the final torchbearer at the 2014 Sochi Olympics, who was denied the gold medal thanks to the Miracle On Ice.

ANSWER: Vladislav Tretiak

21. The singer of one song by this band was "Celebrated but undisturbed/ Serenaded by the terror bird and the songs "Blackeyed Blond" and "American Ghost Dance" appear on this band's 1985 album Freaky Styley. The title track of a different album by this band opens "Psychic spies from China/ Try to steal your mind's elation." Name this rock band of the albums Californication and Stadium Arcadium.

ANSWER: Red Hot Chili Peppers

22. Highlights of this event included Liu Xiang winning China's first gold medal in track and field and Argentina upsetting the U.S. Men's Basketball team in the semifinals. The host country won 16 medals, highlighted by Fani Halkia's gold in women's hurdles after coming out of retirement. Several events were held in historic settings, like a marathon beginning at its namesake site and shot put in Olympia. For the point, name these Olympic games held in Greece for the first time since the inaugural Olympics.

ANSWER: 2004 Summer Olympics or Games of the XXVIII Olympiad; prompt on Athens.

23. Upon graduating from Ohio State, this man intended to spend his career as an amateur like his hero, Bobby Jones. His first victory as a professional came at the 1962 U.S. Open, where he beat rival Arnold Palmer in a playoff. He was the first golfer to win each major three times, and his most famous win came at the age of 46 when he won with Masters with a six under par final round. For the point, name this golfer, nicknamed "the Golden Bear" who holds the career record for major wins with 18.

ANSWER: Jack Nicklaus

24. One character in this movie writes the novel *A Match Made in Space*, perhaps a reference to when "Darth Vader" threatened to melt his brains. The inspiration for one device in this movie came after a character fell and hit his head on a sink; that device is powered by petroleum stolen from Libyan terrorists. Also featuring the Enchantment Under the Sea Dance, name this movie where Michael J. Fox's Marty McFly goes back in time.

ANSWER: Back to the Future

25. In 2009, this woman and her older sister became part-owners of the Miami Dolphins. She has had a few notable run-ins with officials, including once telling a lineswoman she would shove a ball down her throat. She has won 17 singles major titles, six of which came against her older sister, with whom she has won 13 doubles major titles. For the point, name this women's tennis star known for her power, the younger sister of Venus Williams.

ANSWER: Serena Williams; prompt on Williams

26. This movie was based on an unproduced play called *Everybody Comes to Rick's*, and it derived much publicity due to opening shortly after Operation Torch. In it, Victor Laszlo and Ilsa Lund are anti-Nazi fighters trying to reach America, while Captain Louis Renault refuses to arrest the lead when he kills Major Strasser. Name this film that stars Humphrey Bogart as Rick and is set in a Moroccan city.

ANSWER: Casablanca

27. This man's father was murdered while inside a car gifted by his son. That event prompted this man to join a minor league baseball team, leaving behind the team he led to 3 consecutive NBA Championship wins. Upon returning to basketball, this man led his team to 3 additional NBA Championship wins. For the point, name this NBA player who saw great success with the Chicago Bulls, and started his own line of sneakers.

ANSWER: Michael **Jordan**

28. In the 1980 Mundialito tournament consisting of every nation to win the World Cup, this nation hosted and won. They have won two World Cups, one over host Brazil in 1950 and the inaugural 1930 World Cup, which they hosted. In the 2010 World Cup, they defeated Ghana on penalties after a controversial handball before losing to the Netherlands in the semifinals. For the point, name this nation whose soccer team will be led by Diego Forlán and Luis Suárez at the 2014 World Cup.

ANSWER: Uruguay

29. Players of the standard format of this game build decks of 60 cards using up to five colors. One card from this game, Black Lotus, is worth over \$15,000. In this game, Players “tap” land cards for mana to cast creatures, enchantments, spells, and Planeswalkers. Name this trading card game by Wizards of the Coast, most commonly played on Friday nights.

ANSWER: **Magic**: The Gathering

30. The title character of one song by this man volunteered “And forgot the white man’s greed,” and this singer noted “I ain’t seen the sunshine since I don’t know when” in another song. Creator of “The Ballad of Ira Hayes,” this man keeps “a close watch on this heart of mine” in another song. Name this country singer of “Folsom Prison Blues” “I Walk the Line,” and “Ring of Fire.”

ANSWER: Johnny Cash

Backups and Tiebreaks

This singer starred in the baseball movie *A League of Their Own* alongside Geena Davis and Tom Hanks. She had a late 1990's hit called "Hung Up" but her career peaked earlier in the 80's and early 90's with hits such as *Holiday*, *Like a Prayer* and *Like a Virgin*. For the point, name this controversial American singer, who took her stage name from an alternate name for the Virgin Mary and whose other songs include *Material Girl*.

ANSWER: **Madonna**

A 1986 goal made by a man from this country is often regarded as the "Goal of the Century". That man, by the name of Diego Maradona, later led his team to victory in the 1986 FIFA World Cup. The national football jerseys of this country sport signature blue and white vertical stripes, mimicking the colors of this country's flag. For the point, name this South American country with the capital Buenos Aires.

ANSWER: **Argentina**

1. This man's debut albums contains tracks like "Jealousy Woes II" and "W.E.G.O." and he is the member of one group that included Bugz and Proof. He had a public feud with Lynne Cheney, the wife of former US Vice President Dick Cheney, and he quotes Aerosmith on one track that opens "These ideas are nightmares to white parents. This artist of *Encore* and *Relapse* released one track that says "You only get one shot, do not miss your chance to blow." Name this rapper of "The Real Slim Shady" and "Lose Yourself."

ANSWER: **Eminem**

This nation holds the title for having received the second-highest number of Olympic medals, at 1,204. Although it has less than half the number of Olympic medals that the United States has, this nation beat the United States in total medal count more times than it did not. It participated in only 18 Olympic Games. For the point, name this former nation, now divided into several countries, the largest being Russia.

ANSWER: Soviet Union

29. Guillermo Stábile was the first winner of this award in 1930 representing Argentina. 1950 marked the first time that the winner of this award played for the tournament champion. This award was handed to a German in 2010 and 2014, the first time since 1938 and 1950 that consecutive winners have come from the same country. What is this trophy, whose last three winners are Ronaldo, Miroslav Klose, and Thomas Mueller, awarded to the top scorer at the FIFA World Cup?

ANSWER: **Golden Boot** or **Golden Shoe**

Fans voted in April 2014 to renovate this stadium and increase its size instead of replacing it, though it is already the largest stadium in Europe. Qatar Airways' name is controversially painted on the stadium seats, as is the home club's motto, "Mes Que Un Club". It hosted soccer during the 1992 Olympics, but is best known as Lionel Messi's home pitch. For the point, name this stadium of FC Barcelona.

ANSWER: **Camp Nou** or **Nou Camp**
